### When is election day?

**November 8th**

### When are the polls open?

**7am-7pm**

If you are in-line at 7pm you will be able to cast your ballot.



### How can I register to vote for the midterm election?

The voter registration deadline has passed, but all registered voters can vote at their designated polling location on November 8th.



### Who is eligible to vote in Georgia?

#### You Must Be:

1. At least 18 years old
2. A resident of Georgia and the county in which you are voting
3. A citizen of United States
4. Already registered to vote

### Are Senate seats up for election?

Yes! The race is between Raphael Warnock (D) and Herschel Walker (R), along with various other non-major party candidates.

### Is there a gubernatorial election?

Yes! The race is between Stacey Abrams (D) and Brian Kemp (R).



### What are three hot ticket items on the ballot in Georgia?

1. Student loans
2. Free speech in political campaigns
3. Right to gather signed petitions

# COMMON QUESTIONS:

## How does voting in a midterm election work?

Georgia's November 8th midterm election will decide races for the U.S. Senate, state Senate and House, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State and other state executive offices, along with additional state high courts.

## Do I need to be a registered member of a party to vote in the midterms?

No. In Georgia, you do not have to be a registered member of a political party to vote in the midterms. This only applies to the primaries.

## Do I need to show a photo ID to vote?

Yes. You'll need to present a government-issued photo ID when voting in person. You can use a valid driver's license (even an expired one), a free state-issued ID, passport, military ID, student ID from a public college or university in Georgia, or an employee ID issued by a local, state, or federal government.

## How do I find my polling place?

On Election Day, you must vote at your designated polling place. You can find your assigned polling location on your voter registration card or by logging into the Secretary of State's My Voter Page: <https://mvp.sos.ga.gov/s/>.

## Can I vote at any polling place in my county?

In the state of Georgia, one must go to their designated polling location.

## What is a provisional ballot?

A provisional ballot is a paper ballot used by a voter when their eligibility to vote cannot be determined at the polling place. Voters who declare they are registered and eligible to vote in the county in which they desire to vote, but whose names do not appear on the registration list, must be permitted to cast a provisional ballot.

### How can I register to vote for the midterm election?

The voter registration deadline has passed, but all registered voters can vote at their designated polling location on November 8th.



### Who is eligible to vote in Pennsylvania?

#### You Must Be:

1. At least 18 years old
2. A resident of Pennsylvania and the county in which you are voting
3. A citizen of United States
4. Already registered to vote



### Are Senate seats up for election?

Yes! Pat Toomey (R) is not seeking reelection. The race is between John Fetterman (D) and Mehmet Oz (R), along with various other non-major party candidates.

### Is there a gubernatorial election?

Yes! Current Governor Tom Wolf is term limited. The race is between Josh Shapiro (D) and Doug Mastriano (R).



### What are three hot ticket items on the ballot in Pennsylvania?

1. Abortion
2. Economy/ Inflation
3. Subjects taught in school (LGBT issues, race, etc.)



# COMMON QUESTIONS:

## How does voting in a midterm election work?

Pennsylvania's November 8th midterm election will decide races for the U.S. Senate, state Senate and House, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Secretary of State and other state executive offices, along with additional state high courts.

## Do I need to be a registered member of a party to vote in the midterms?

No. In Pennsylvania, you do not have to be a registered member of a political party to vote in the midterms. This only applies to primaries.

## Do I need to show a photo ID to vote?

Yes. If it is your first time voting at a polling place, you need proof of identification. If it is not your first time, Pennsylvania generally does not require voters to present identification

## How do I find my polling place?

On Election Day, you must vote at your designated polling place. You can find your assigned polling location using <https://www.pavoterservices.pa.gov/Pages/PollingPlaceInfo.aspx>.

## Can I vote at any polling place in my county?

In the state of Pennsylvania, you must vote at your designated polling location

**How can I register to vote for the midterm election?**

You cannot register the Saturday, Sunday, or Monday before an election, but in Wisconsin you can register at the polling place on Election Day.



**Who is eligible to vote in Wisconsin?**

**You Must Be:**

1. At least 18 years old
2. A resident of Wisconsin and the county in which you are voting
3. A citizen of United States
4. Already registered to vote

**Are Senate seats up for election?**

Yes! The race is between Mandela Barnes (D) and the incumbent Ron Johnson (R).

**Is there a gubernatorial election?**

Yes! The race is between Incumbent Tony Evers (D) and Tim Michels (R).



**What are three hot ticket items on the ballot in Wisconsin?**

1. Gun Rights
2. Legalization of Marijuana
3. Economy/Inflation



# COMMON QUESTIONS:

## How does voting in a midterm election work?

Wisconsin's November 8th midterm election will decide races for the U.S. Senate and House, state Senate and House, Governor, Lieutenant Governor, Attorney General, and other state executive offices. There will also be various ballot measures to weigh in on.

## Do I need to be a registered member of a party to vote in the midterms?

No. In Wisconsin, you do not have to be a registered member of a political party to vote in the midterms. This only applies to the primaries.

## Do I need to show a photo ID to vote?

Yes. Click link below for a list of acceptable forms of identification. If you plan to register at the polls on Election Day, you need to provide a Proof of Residence document.
